### Indiana ASCD in Partnership with the NWIESC Presents: Managing the Angry and Aggressive Student, K-12

There is widespread concern over the increasing frequency of aggression being exhibited by students. The number of students in American schools with aggressive behavior is one of the leading concerns of teachers, administrators, and parents and a favorite subject of the national media.

Longitudinal research and epidemiological findings will be discussed that indicates students who continue to be aggressive are at high risk for developing academic and social impairment in the educational system.

This workshop will focus on providing participants with knowledge of effective intervention strategies to implement in their program. Specifically, the following activities will be emphasized: (1)-identifying factors that facilitate anger and aggression in students. (2) Identifying specific classroom strategies for prevention and intervention of anger and aggression. (3) Presenting the components of a unique model of intervention for dealing with aggression.

This intensive workshop has been designed to provide practical and readily applicable interventions for addressing and facilitating constructive change. Key topic areas include:

- Improving self-control through the areas of anger management and developing impulse control.
- Focusing on developing empathic responses towards others.
- Facilitating interpersonal and problem-solving skills

Through didactic presentation, experiential exercises, and case examples, participants will be able to intervene effectively to help students turn anger and misdirected aggression into an appropriate response.
